| College Location (Town/State) | <p>Providence, Rhode Island About an hour south of Boston and 3.5 hours north of NYC - takes about 6.5-7 hours to drive from Brown to MD Providence Airport is about 15 minutes from campus - you can also take Amtrak to campus, and the station is a 10 minute walk away!</p> |
| School Size (Number of Students) | <p>6,800 undergraduate students</p> <p>Students come from all over the world. 11% of students are International citizens.</p> |

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| | <p>Each concentration has specific mandatory classes, outside of those mandatory classes, you have to take a handful of extra classes within that concentration but you can choose. All other classes are up to you! No “General Education” courses.</p> <p>25-30% of students do a “double concentration”</p> |
| Any Special Information about Graduate Programs? | <p>Program in Liberal Medical Education: combines undergraduate education and professional studies in medicine in an 8-year program</p> <p>Brown / RISD Dual Degree Program: dual degree 5 year program, finish with a B.A. or B.S. from Brown and a B.F.A. from RISD.</p> <p>5th Year Master’s Degree Programs: a lot of different programs that combine undergraduate and graduate programs in 5 years</p> |

| Average Accepted GPA | There are no minimums or cutoffs in Brown's application review process. We do not make our admissions decisions based on a grade average or class rank without also considering the many other factors that help us gauge an applicant's promise. |
| Parking for Freshmen? | Parking is not recommended! You can use your Student ID to take the bus around the area for free! The campus is very pedestrian friendly. |
| Housing Information | Students are required to live on campus for the first three years - housing is guaranteed for all students. Students typically start living in doubles. All housing units have a Residential Peer Counselor and Minority Peer Counselor. Housing and Dining |
