Housing Information	<p>87% of students live on campus - students are required to live on campus for all 4 years unless you have family that lives within 40 miles of campus</p> <p>3 Residential Halls -Asbury and Skeath Halls - co-ed by floor/wing, traditional dormitory life -Wesley 1st floor - STEM affinity housing, has single bathrooms and kitchenette on each wing</p> <p>FYRST Program - First Year Residents Succeeding Together</p> <p>Upperclassmen have 6 residential halls, co-ed, affinity, female-only, Greek Housing, and 36 furnished apartments</p>
Any Special notes for COVID-19?	Dining halls have been updated to allow for social distancing and outdoor seating has also been added throughout the campus. Campus is 100% open and functioning - with the school only having 1200 students, it’s a lot more manageable. Class sizes are

	<p>being limited to reduce student-to-student contact.</p> <p>There is also a Quarantine process for students - students are put in a quarantine facility and the campus will contact people you have been in contact with and they will quarantine until everyone is COVID-19 tested.</p>
Dining Options	<p>One campus dining hall, but also many different other dining locations. There is also a late-night dining option for students.</p>
