Average Accepted GPA	3.54 weighted GPA for accepted students, on average.
Parking for Freshmen?	Yes! You can have cars as a freshman for free.
Housing Information	Living on Campus at Stevenson All dorms are suite style, and students share bathrooms and a living area with three other people.

<p>Financial Aid Information (Deadlines, Forms, and Special Programs?)</p>	<p>There are merit-based scholarships that have a priority deadline of Dec. 1 (final deadline of Feb. 1). They have an automatic consideration policy for the merit-based scholarship, and range from \$10,000 to 20,800 per year.</p> <p>Presidential Fellowship: 150-160 applicants per year, only about 10-15 recipients (Full-tuition scholarship, 3.7 GPA minimum), priority deadline of Dec. 1.</p> <p>Leadership Scholars and Service Scholars funding (this requires a written application, 3.3 GPA minimum). The amount is \$2,000 and the deadline to apply is Jan. 15</p> <p>Theatre and Visual Arts Scholarship (audition/portfolio based application), The amount is \$2,000 and the deadline is Jan. 15</p> <p>Founders' Scholarship requires interview application, 3.0 GPA, \$2,000 award, with a March 1 Deadline.</p>

Other Important / Interesting Facts	<p>Small liberal arts school</p> <p>They have pre-health advisors that help with students interested in health professions. They host MCAT boot camps, college fairs, career fairs, etc. to help you prepare for applying to professional health programs.</p> <p>They do virtual information sessions on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays at 3 p.m. Register at stevenson.edu/visit</p> <p>They have a shuttle but many people also walk around campus since it's pretty small.</p>
