	<p>3 Application Components</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Candidate Application: Transcript (GPA), Test Scores (SAT Essay or ACT Writing is required); Extracurricular activities and School Official Evaluations to demonstrate leadership; Candidate Fitness Assessment (basketball throw, pull-ups, shuttle run, sit-ups, push-ups, one-mile; Video submission required for these events); Interview is Required ● Nomination: Congressional (typically due by September or October; apply through congressional office; contact them early!) or Service-Connected (Presidential, Soldiers, ROTC/JROTC, Sons and Daughters of 100% disabled veterans or career military members, Sons & Daughters of Medal of Honor awardees) ● Medical Qualification: By April 15th: you will receive an email from West Point to get seen by a medical provider (they will cover all costs); qualification takes up to 90 days; they are just evaluating your physical and mental health
Are you test optional this year?	Test Flexible, but it benefits you to have some kind of test scores on file (including PSAT)
Average Accepted GPA	SAT: Shoot for 550 or above for verbal and math (about 1100) (average for Class of 2024 was a 1320 SAT or a 30 ACT)

Parking for Freshmen?	You can have a car as a Junior in your second semester.

Other Important / Interesting Facts	<p>Legacy of Leadership</p> <p>Everyone that graduates from West Point is commissioned into the Army for 5 Years of service</p> <p>Every summer, students spend 3-5 weeks in some kind of military training (Examples: Cadet Basic Training, Mountain School in other countries, Airborne School, etc.)</p>

Physical Development - you have to take specific classes each year, including Boxing, Military Movement, Survival Swimming, Combat Applications, Indoor Obstacle course

Sponsorship Program - you get assigned a “family” that supports you throughout your time in West Point

Freshmen do not get to leave campus frequently unless affiliated with clubs or sports teams
