What are your application deadlines?	3 deadlines: Early Decision (BINDING) - Nov. 1 deadline, with offer received by mid-December Early Action (Non-Binding) - Dec. 1: Notification in Mid-February, and you have until May to decide. Regular Decision (Space Availability): Jan 15. FAFSA: Jan 22, 2021
What application materials are required?	You need to report your classes and should have a rigorous academic curriculum. You also need to complete four personal statements focused on: Service, Resilience, Leadership, and Long-term goals

Are you test optional this year?	Yes! If you're not comfortable with your SAT or ACT score, you don't have to include it in your application to VT. That will not be held against you!
Average Accepted GPA	Academic rigor is important to VT, and the average accepted GPA was 3.97.
Parking for Freshmen?	Yes, freshmen can bring cars!
Housing Information	Freshmen are expected to stay on campus their freshmen year. After that, they can choose where they want to live.
