School Size (Number of Students)	Approximately 1,450 students are enrolled at St. Mary's.

Notable Majors / Programs	They have 75 academic programs , including double and interdisciplinary majors. Biology is one of the most popular majors on campus, and St. Mary's has a very strong track record for health professional programs.
